We have all enjoyed the warmer weather and making the most of outside learning over the last couple of weeks. There has been a lot happening at both our Dumbleton and Alderton bases, with gardening, trips being organized and enjoyed and practicing for Sports Day and the Year 5 and 6 show. All the children have been busy rehearsing for their end of term show and showing off their creative skills making excellent props. Their enthusiasm is infectious and it is really lovely to hear them singing and practicing their lines.
