There is now an outline planning application for the erection of up to 55 dwellings in the field behind the houses of St Margarets Drive, St Margarets Road & Fletcher Close and the demolition of 16 St Margarets Drive.

This proposed development is:

- Not in the Neighbourhood Plan
- Not in the Tewksbury Borough Plan (now approved)
- Outside the village boundary
- On top of the 75 houses already built in the last few years and the 28 houses in the new Cala development
- Using access down a narrow residential road
- Bringing extra traffic into the village
- Losing valuable and scenic pasture land
- Put forward without a public meeting
- Close to the historic centre of the village & the Winchcombe Way
