**PLANNING APPEAL – CALA HOMES**. Parish Councillors have met with the Borough Council to discuss the Appeal and have also participated in a Case Management Conference with the Planning Inspectorate and the main parties. The Inquiry is to be held as a virtual event (Microsoft Teams) opening at 10am on **Tuesday 6 July 2021**. It is envisaged that the Appeal will take place over 4 days. The Parish Council will be playing a full part in the Enquiry calling a number of witnesses and submitting further evidence. Any parishioners who made representations at the application and/or appeal stages should receive a notice from the Borough Council detailing the Inquiry arrangements. Anyone wishing to attend the Inquiry to observe the event, or take an active part in the Inquiry, should follow the instructions in the Borough Council's notice.

## **PARISH PLANNING** – Four new applications have been received:

- 4 Ellenor Drive, Alderton (21/00539/FUL) Erection of a rear extension
- The Wilderness, 3 Beckford Road, Alderton (21/00408/FUL) Conversion of existing lean to into a timber framed garage and erection of a front porch
- Red Rose Cottage, 3 Blacksmiths Road, Alderton (21/00649/FUL) Erection of a replacement garden room
- 10 Beckford Road, Alderton (21/00620/FUL) Removal of existing garage and erection of dependants accommodation

The following application has received permission for development: 9 Beckford Road, Alderton (20/01282/FUL) - Erection of 2 No. two storey detached dwellings and provision of associated vehicular access and parking areas and hard and soft landscaping (revised application following approval of application reference 19/01009/FUL).

#### OAK HILL C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

Despite being extremely damp, May has been a very exciting month, full of hope and activity! There have been a lot of different things going on at both bases and it has been really wonderful to see the children enjoying all that has been organised by our brilliant staff.

The children at our Infant Base in Dumbleton have spent a lot of time outside in the forest and garden area growing vegetables. They have been watering them every day and keeping an eye on their progress. The carrots and lettuce are enormous!

Reception Class have been learning about traditional fairy tales, focussing on Goldilocks and the Three Bears, while Years 1 and 2 have been rewriting Jack and the Beanstalk. The children are so enthusiastic and have really enjoyed developing their writing skills during this topic.

There was great excitement as our Infant Base went on their first school trip this month and took the GWSR train from Winchcombe to Cheltenham. A child from Year 2 wrote the following:

"On the day of the trip we were all excited! We got on the bus. When we got there we met a lady and she told us the rules. Then, we went to wait for our train. We heard a bell, then saw smoke and steam rise up and when the train arrived we all got on. After that, we found our carriage but we weren't allowed to stick our heads out of the window. Then, we heard a rumble and a burst of steam rushed past us and we set off waving at the people on the platform. Next, we saw sheep and a dog out of the window whilst we ate our snack. We got off the train and we saw it turn around before getting back on to go back to Winchcombe. When we got back to the station we had a run around on the grass and then we had our lunch as we were very hungry! After lunch, we went on a hunt around the platforms to look for the things on our sheet. I found a lot of things. Then we said goodbye and we went back on the bus to school". The trip was a huge success and we felt so proud when a member of the public told a member of staff how well behaved the children were, how cheerful and lovely they were and how nice it was to see them out and about.

Colour walks, games, sharing encouraging messages and discussions about mental health were among some of the activities that the whole school took part in during Mental Health Awareness Week. After such a challenging year, it is even more important to us to provide the children with support and space to be themselves and explore what that means for each individual.

Each year we have a visit from the Life Education Bus which provides space and opportunity for children to learn about their bodies and how to look after them. Children at our Infant Base learnt about exercise and looking after their bodies, while children in Year 3 and 4 were fascinated to learn more about the brain and how that controls the body . Year 5 and 6 joined in discussions about drugs, learning how to be safe and how to stand up for themselves.

Our Year 3 and 4 children have enjoyed cricket and developing their skills each week. It is a pleasure to be able to walk children down to the field to enjoy that outside space and the huge amount of rain hasn't put anyone off!

Whilst our wonderful staff are planning more visits and constantly working hard to achieve the best experiences for our children, we are still doing quite a lot virtually. We welcomed the RNLI into our school via Zoom to give a talk on water safety which was fascinating.

Maypole Dancing was able to go ahead this month and it was such fun to see the children at our Junior Base laughing and really enjoying themselves. The hall was filled with music and fun and they learned some very complex routines. Two children from Year 6 wrote the following:

"Doing maypole dancing was a great experience! We learnt lots of patterns, one of which was the great weave which we all picked up exceedingly quickly. It was super fun and the pole almost touched the roof of the hall! Only three words can describe this opportunity: FUN, stupendous and unbelievable".

Year 5 and 6 have been cooking up a storm in the kitchen making bread as part of topic work while studying the story of the Titanic. There were some very imaginative toppings and the kitchen smelt wonderful! They will celebrate the end of this topic with a posh cream tea, eating scones they have made.

We are excited about the fact that two of our Year 5 and 6 children have been selected to attend the K'Nex Challenge after the class took part in a workshop earlier this month. The workshop is extremely popular and it is really exciting to see some of the wonderful models that are created.

May has been a really encouraging month and we are looking forward to all that the rest of the summer term brings.

### **EVESHAM BAT CARE**

It's been weird weather this year so far, and the wildlife is just as thrown as us. The cold and dry nights of April followed by the wettest May on record has meant that many animals have been struggling. Insects numbers have been down, particularly at night when bats and hedgehogs are trying to feed, and many wildlife rescuers have been reported unusually high numbers of starving bats. Any food we can put out for wildlife will really help them get through these strange months. Bird feeders and hedgehog feeding stations are also a great way we can watch the wildlife in our gardens and learn what they get up to. Whilst we can't put out food for the bats themselves, planting night scented flowers that will attract their insect prey will help them. A wildlife pond is also the best habitat we can provide, as it not only acts as a source of water when the weather is dry but provides a home for many insects that our mammals feed on. They don't even need to be that big, a simple washing up bowl can host a surprising amount of wildlife.
