**PLANNING APPEAL – CALA HOMES.** This Appeal will be determined by a Public Inquiry, commencing on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021. The Parish Council will be taking part in a case management conference with the main parties and the Planning Inspectorate on 18<sup>th</sup> May. The aim is to ensure that the Inquiry is conducted in an efficient and effective manner which optimises the Inquiry time.

**PARISH PLANNING** – No new applications have been received to date.

**ANNUAL PARISH MEETING** – This will be held on **25**<sup>th</sup> **May** 2021, at **7.30pm**, in the Village Hall. Please note this will be subject to Government guidelines at the time and face masks must be worn. The agenda will focus on some broad topics such as housing, the playing field and allotments. Organisations may submit reports if they wish, and these will be compiled into the usual summary. We are not expecting individual reports to be made at the meeting. Our aim is to keep the meeting as short as possible. If you would prefer not to attend but have a parish related question then please contact the Clerk beforehand.

**LOCAL ELECTIONS** – these are scheduled to take place on **6**<sup>th</sup> **May** 2021 for the Police and Crime Commissioner and Gloucestershire County Council. The polling station in Alderton is the Village Hall which will be open between 7am and 10pm on 6<sup>th</sup> May.

We started the year with a new Headteacher, Mr Greaves. He brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to this valuable role. His enthusiasm, passion and drive are at the core of his vision for Oak Hill Primary School. He supports our staff and children and works closely with our new Chair of Governors, Mrs Leather. Mrs Leather joined us in September, providing much support during the autumn term, and continuing to focus on positively moving forward as we navigate through the pandemic.

We really enjoyed welcoming the children back to school after the third lockdown ended in early March. It has been wonderful to hear classrooms full of laughter, see joy on their faces and to see how well they have settled back into the routine of school life.

Both our infant base at Dumbleton and our junior base at Alderton are at the centre of these villages and surrounded by wonderful countryside. An increasing amount of our learning is taking place outside and we feel fortunate to offer the children plenty of space within the natural surroundings to learn and explore.

Oak Hill is supported by FOOHS, our parents' group, who work hard to provide for and enrich the lives of the children here. There is a strong, supportive school community of staff, governors, parents and local residents who all contribute to the vibrant life of the school.

Many clubs and activities have been put on hold for the last year but we were able to arrange for Project Touchline to visit the school over the last month to give rugby coaching to all children at both bases. The coaching teaches Christian values alongside rugby and has proven popular over the years.

World Book Day took place just before lockdown came to an end and pupils both at home and school celebrated with some wonderfully colourful and creative costumes. The children of key workers that were in school decorated t shirts with their favourite story character.

A night vision camera was kindly donated to our Dumbleton base and, much to the children's delight, a hare was filmed leaping around and a cat was spotted chasing a mouse! Part of the outside space at Dumbleton is the forest school area named Dumblewood. Lots of great activities take place here including building mini beast houses and gardening.

Children at both bases are very keen to contribute to the development of the outside space. They have some exciting ideas and there are plans for developing the pond area at Alderton which is currently home to frogspawn.

At Alderton, Year 3 and 4 have enjoyed reading How to Train Your Dragon, writing descriptive instructions for dragon training and studying the poetry of John Lyons which they have thoroughly enjoyed. Last week one of our Year 3 pupil's parents brought in two ewes and lambs to meet the class.

Year 5 and 6 have been learning about parliament and held a debate about smoking which they found really interesting and enjoyable. They recently studied the rainforest and finished the topic with a dress up day featuring a fabulous selection of animal costumes!

### **EVESHAM BAT CARE**

The nice weather is finally here, gardens are starting to bloom and everyone's been able to get outdoors more. I for one have been enjoying the sunshine, though I did manage to get sunburnt today. Did you know that's there more land in private gardens than any other land use in this country? This means that our gardens can be a hugely valuable habitat for our wildlife, with sometimes only a few small changes. Leaving a small corner of our gardens untidy, with leaf piles or log piles, or not deadheading flowers over winter, can offer a home for insects, which in turn feed a lot of other things. Night-scented plants in particular if you want to help support bats, as the plants feed the insects that bats rely on.
