PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ALDERTON NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN – A reminder that the public consultation on the Alderton NDP closes at 5pm on Monday 30th October 2017. If you wish to make comments then please go to Tewkesbury Borough Council's website where you will find copies of the Plan documents and how to respond: https://www.tewkesbury.gov.uk/aldertonneighbourhood-plan

Following on from the recent Regulation 16 consultation the next stage in the process will be an independent examination of the Alderton NDP. This will make sure that the proper legal process has been followed and that the Plan meets the basic conditions, including general conformity with strategic local policy. Tewkesbury Borough Council will appoint an appropriately qualified and experienced person to carry out the independent examination, but the appointment has to be agreed with the Parish Council. The Borough Council will send to the independent examiner the Plan and supporting information, plus a copy of any comments received during the Regulation 16 consultation. Once the examination is complete, the examiner will issue a report to the Borough Council and the Parish Council.

B4077 ROAD SAFETY – At the time of going to press the installation of the signage for the new 50mph speed limit is nearing completion. It's been agreed that the Parish Council will pursue the purchase of a speed indicator device (SID) which can be moved around various problem locations within the parish. The device will display the speed of an approaching vehicle, along with the message 'slow down' if it is exceeding the set speed threshold. The SID will be purchased through the County Council's Community Match funding grant whereby the Parish Council and County Council each provide 50% of the funding.

DOG FOULING – The Parish Council have received complaints of dog fouling outside the school. A reminder to any dog owners who fail to clear up after their canines – it's illegal, it's anti-social and there isn't a dog pooh fairy out there. Bag it and bin it in the dog waste bins please.

ALLOTMENT PLOTS – The site is currently full, but please get in touch with the Clerk if you wish to add your name to the waiting list.
